It is with a saddened heart that I open this letter with a realization that there are so many families that have been negatively impacted by the events that occurred during the past 6 months – most notably Hurricane or Superstorm Sandy, the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut, and most recently in our own community, the Webster shootings with the deaths of two brave Firefighters. Each of these events leave in its wake, everlasting effects on families' lives, both physically and psychologically, effects on their communities with loss of homes and property, and on all of us because we care. We join all the nations' people in prayer for all those directly involved, for those who came to their aid, and for those who will never forget there is much healing that will need to take place following these and all tragedies.

As I have done in the past I wish to review our Lodge's past year in this January edition of the newsletter "The Roar of the Lion" and as I come to the end of my term as your President, reflect on our achievements and set some challenges for the future. We recognized early that 2012 was the 40th Anniversary year of our Lodge's charter. We spent many hours throughout the following several months putting together 2 commemoratives of photos – a souvenir publication distributed to all our members (free) and a wonderful DVD which focused more on our recent activities which played throughout the Columbus Day Dinner Dance and which we will use to foster new membership. Early in the year we were saddened by the passing of our Brother Louis Giambra who had been an active member of our Lodge since its earliest years and who achieved the honor of becoming Bene Emeritus, an honor recognizing not only his activities in our Lodge but also in both the State Grand Lodge and the National Supreme Lodge.

In February we held the Valentine Dinner Dance at Midvale – an event to raise money for the Pluta Cancer Center's Volunteer Services. During that time I also renewed communication with our Brother Dr. Joseph Polizzi who recently had published his new novel THE GOLDEN ORRERY. Dr. Polizzi lives in Florida and has continued his membership in our Lodge throughout the years. We recognized also that other members of our Lodge also have recently published – Sister Elizabeth Osta and Brother Dr. Ed Maruggi. We are honored to have them as members. In 2012 Brother Joe Capogreco celebrated 45 years on Carosello Italiano and in April was responsible for delighting us with a dinner concert at Mario's - renowned Italian American singer Michael Castaldo was wonderful. On April 12th Senator Joe Robach attended our General Assembly meeting presenting the Lodge with an official Senate Resolution recognizing our 40th Anniversary.. In May we had a very successful fundraiser at Five Guys restaurant in Henrietta where we raised money designated for AUTISM. As most of you know we collect Coke product caps and with these we were able to acquire an MP3 player raffled off at the Valentine dinner. We continue to collect these caps and have also saved much in printing costs by redeeming Staples Reward Points from your empty ink cartridges – keep them coming!!

In June several of us attended the NYOSIA Convention at the Villa Roma. Sister Jen R. has the "gift Gallery" concession at which she sells items (shirts, bibs, aprons) to the attendees from her business. The Grand Lodge gets a part of the profits. Your delegates participate in various meetings as well as on Committees. Our Lodge donates \$300 to \$500 to various charities each year (this year Autism, Alzheimer's, Breast Cancer, Cooley's Anemia, Garibaldi Meucci Museum (brick)). The Immediate Past President and the President are required to attend plus 3 delegates chosen by the membership. In July we participated in the FESTA ITALIANA at the IACC – a very successful fundraiser for the Lodge.

As members of the ICL our delegates spent a considerable amount of time along with other clubs trying to resurrect the Community Italian American PARADE and a Festa to be held in Irondequoit. Due to limited time and support this event was unable to be realized.

In August, the President's Membership Appreciation Picnic was held at our home. We had over 70 attendees, great music by Jon Seiger's Group, great food supplied by our members and all at no cost to our members and their families. Several members were given a President's Appreciation Award including Sisters Susan Berta, Eunice McCarthy, Jennifer Rubé, Mary Ricci, Shirley Sculli, Angie Parise and Brother Louis DeCarolis - all very deserving.

September was quiet but preparations were being made for October's Columbus Day Dinner Dance This event was held at Midvale Country Club and honors were presented to JoAnn Palermo Ryan, Martin Mucci, Joseph Berta, and Thomas Ferrara as well as 3 scholarships to Matthew Sisto, Derek Clar, and Michael Desino. We were VERY honored also to have our National President Joseph DiTrapani and State President Thom Lupo come up to Rochester from Long Island to present us with a recognition plaque for our 40th Anniversary. One very sad note was that in leaving our event, Len Hawley (provided our music as he has done on many occasions) was involved in an auto accident. He succumbed to complications of his injuries in December. We will miss him very much as will the whole Community. The CDDD and the Souvenir Ad Book are our major fundraisers of the year and were very successful in that regard. Midvale is booked again for next year's event. In early December we got together at Gigi's for our Christmas dinner with good food, great ad lib entertainment and great company.

I think I've included most activities - Sister Jen and I attended a Grand Lodge Leadership Conference in Long Island where we learned a lot. Membership was big topic and we utilized the info at successfully recruiting new members since then. I'm very proud to report we initiated 16 new members this year and we have 7 new applications with initiations at the January General Assembly Meeting. Thanks to all who are responsible for these new members, especially at a time when most organizations are losing members. We also found out that we had lost our tax exempt status - many hours were spent by our Financial Secretary in providing our tax lawyer with financial info needed to reinstate this status. The application was submitted in September and as of today we still have not received a response from the IRS. For 2013 we have already scheduled our Officer Installation Brunch to be held March 10th at Penfield CC. We also have planned a family social event at Pittsford Park Lodge with catered food that will include steamed & fresh clams (see flyer). Communication has been enhanced with our members thanks to newsletters going out by email to those who have it and mail to those who do not, update notices initiated by sister Jen, web site improvement, etc. Our Nominating Committee is working to provide us with a slate of Officers at the January General assembly meeting (Jan. 10th) and at that meeting we will also be voting for a vacated Board position needed until the new Board is installed in March.

For the coming year I will work closely with your new Board (Council) and all of you to continue our growth in membership, fundraising, and in making those changes that are needed to retain our present membership. We have discussed things like making member participation more affordable. We can do that and still maintain our financial well being. I believe we should demonstrate more support for Grand Lodge activities. I believe your Delegates to the Convention should receive more money to defray costs to them. I would like to see us move forward (with the Grand Lodge) in such areas as telecommunications that will allow more participation in events downstate as well as moving toward computerization of our finances and other activities. I'd like to see our members start offering to give mini presentations at our meetings and yet still make our meeting shorter in time for business and more time to get to know each other better socially. It can be done!

In closing, let us remember in our prayers those who have lost a loved one, those lost in the recent tragedies, those who have been ill/hospitalized, and those in the military and first responders who protect us and care for us.

ITALIAN NEW YEARS TRADITIONS

The evening begins with a traditional dish, “cotechino e lenticchie” Cotechino is a delicious, savory, fresh pork sausage, typically sold either partially pre-cooked or raw. The meat itself consists of “lo zampone,” the actual hoof of the pig, and is a symbol of abundance and bountifulness as represented by the meat’s high fat content, richness, and flavor. **Lenticchie** (lentils) are believed to bring good luck and prosperity in the coming year to those who eat them on New Year’s Eve. These tiny oval-shaped legumes, reminiscent of gold coins, represent the money that one will earn in the coming year. Needless to say, the more you eat, the better off you’ll be financially!

The dinner concludes with dried fruit and grapes. According to tradition, having **grapes** present on the table during New Year’s ensures that those sitting at the table will be wise and frugal spenders of money. This is based on the idea that one must exercise significant willpower in order to conserve grapes taken from the grape harvest without eating them until New Year’s Eve. A person with such willpower will surely be a wise and frugal spender in the coming year!
