Biography, State President Robert M. Ferrito

Robert M. Ferrito has been active in the Order Sons of Italy in America (OSIA) for over 20 years. Prior to becoming President, he served as the State 1st Vice President of the Grand Lodge of New York. Robert is a dedicated and involved member and past president of the John D. Calandra Lodge #2600 in Yonkers, New York.

A proud Italian American, he joined the Order Sons of Italy in America to assist in preserving his Italian heritage. Through the years, he has been very active in the District IV area in which he lives, and after serving as the John D. Calandra President, he went on to serve as the New York OSIA State Trustee, Sate Treasurer, State Orator, State 2nd Vice President, and 1st Vice President. During his role as State 2nd Vice President, he served as the State Fundraising Chairperson and met his budgetary obligations while serving in that capacity.

Robert's dedication to community and charitable projects is exemplified by thirty-five years of commitment to numerous organizations. Interest in community affairs began in his birthplace of Bronx, New York. It was here that he became involved in various civic organizations. He belonged to the Parish Council at St. Lucy's School, as well as the Fathers' Club. He served as President of the Fathers' Club, and he was instrumental in providing safe recreation for the students of the school. Robert also became a member of the Bronx Columbus Day Parade Committee and the Columbus Alliance, an organization of which he later served as President.

Robert's track record of involvement continued when he relocated to Yonkers, a city in which he quickly felt at home. He held the title of President of the Maria Regina High School Parent's Association and served as President of the Eleventh Ward Republican Club, Co-ward Leader of the Eleventh Ward. Robert has volunteered his time on several political campaigns.

Robert also served as President of the Yonkers Board of Education, as well as a member of the Police Athletic League in the City of Yonkers, and also worked as Special Assistant to the mayor of Yonkers and Deputy Director of the Yonkers Parking Authority. Always displaying his pride in his heritage, Robert has been a proud member of the Yonkers Columbus Day Committee and served as General Chairman on numerous occasions. He currently serves as the Yonkers Columbus Day Foundation President. Robert's basic philosophy is that giving back to one's community is essential in order to preserve a quality of life in the city one calls home. "To do more for the world than the world does for you - that is success," according to Henry Ford.

Robert is an Electrical Contractor who has owned and operated his own business, R.M.F. Electric, Inc., for 31 years. Robert has been married to his wife, Lina, for 43 years. CSJ Report - Inspiring Italian Women throughout History Sister Marjorie Focarazzo

It's a pretty great time to be a woman. Women have access to education, economic opportunities, and leadership roles. They have made their way to the head of the table in industries such as finance, design and marketing. They view technology, research, and energy no longer as being male dominated. They have broken traditional barriers throughout time and history. Some are well known, others not, but each has made an impact and contribution to our society.

Trota of Salerno was a medical doctor and is generally considered the world's first gynecologist and first female professor in the 11th and early 12th century. Much of her work was forgotten until rediscovered in the 20th century, but along with comprehensive works on women's medicine, she treated a wide range of afflictions from snake bites to bad breath.

Prior to the 17th century, art was also typically closed off to women, but Artemiasia Gentilesche, a Baroque painter, was able to achieve success in spite of personal misfortune, which influenced the progressive and experimental nature of her painting. While her work was neglected for centuries, there has been a surge of interest in the past few decades, and until May 2017. Her work was exhibited at Rome's Palazzo Braschi.

Women who continue studying at colleges and universities own gratitude to Elena Cornaro Piscopia, the first women to get an academic university degree with a PhD in philosophy in 1678. After being conferred with her degree, she explained some of the most difficult passages of Aristotle in Classical Latin. She was fluent in seven languages and an accomplished musician on the harpsicord, harp, and violin.

Rita Levi-Montalcini was a pioneering, persevering scientist who was a joint recipient of a Nobel Prize for her work on neurology. Rita faced many challenges: her father disapproved of her desire to go to medical school and Mussolini's passage of Italy's Racial Laws meant that as a Jew, she could no longer work in academia. She did not let either deter her, and once the war was over, she continued her work receiving many awards and accolades until her death at the age of 103 in 2012.

Tina Anselmi was Italy's first female minister. During World War II she played an active part in the underground resistance. She studied literature and became an elementary teacher, writing a series of books for children and young adults about her experiences in the resistance. In 1976 she became Italy's first female cabinet member, first as Minister for Labor and then as Minister for Health. She believed in equal rights, getting a bill passed that recognized fathers as primary caregivers. She chaired the National Equal Opportunities Commission and advocated for equal pay. She was the first living person to be commemorated on a postage stamp. Days later she died (Oct. 2016) at the age of 89.

Two well-known actresses in film are Anna Magnani and Sophia Loren. Magnani was the most celebrated Italian actress in the post war era, having won the Academy Award for Best Actress along with four international awards, for her role as a Sicilian widow in The Rose Tattoo, a role written for her by Tennessee Williams. Loren has won more than 50 international awards including the Academy Award for Best Actress in 1962 for her role in Two Women, a Golden Globe, a Grammy, a BAFTA and a Laurel Award. Sophia also ventured into the business world and became the first actress to launch her own fragrance and design eye wear. Today, at the age of 72, she spends time with her sons and their families.

Livia Pomodoro is an expert in family and juvenile law and is the first woman president of the Court of Milan since 2007. Livia also sits on the Italian Supreme Court, is a member of the United Nations Economic and Social Council, and a member of the UNESCO National Commission.

Chiara Saraceno is one of the most celebrated sociologists in Europe with a distinguished academic career, research, and serves on editorial boards of several journals.

Valeria Termini was the first female dean of the Scuola superiore della pubblica amministrazione. She currently is the commissioner of the Italian Regulatory Authority of Electricity and Gas and has led a dele4gation for Energy and Climate Change at G8, United Nations and OECD.

Gaia Gaja is one of the most knowledgeable and influential women in the wine industry. She is heiress to the Gaja Winery founded by her great-great-grandfather in 1859. Located in the Piedmonte region, also home to the famous white truffle, the winery is best known for its Barbaresco and Barolo wines. It's no surprise that the Slow Food movement (now an international phenomenon) began here in the village of "Bra".

Fabiola Gianotti is a particle physicist and is the first woman to head the world famous European Organization for Nuclear Research in Geneva, Switzerland. She was one of the leaders to discover the Higgs Boson, the long sought building block of the universe which is the theoretical discovery of a mechanism that contributes to our understanding of the origin of mass of subatomic particles.

Samantha Cristoforetti is an Italian Air Force pilot, engineer, and the first Italian woman in space. She is also one of the first women to hold the rank of lieutenant and fighter pilot in Italy.

George Bernard Shaw wrote: You see things; and you say 'Why?' But I dream things that never were, and I say 'Why not?' Each of these women grew up with dreams and aspirations as many do. And perhaps they never believed they could be someone who could make a difference, especially in fields mostly dominated and regulated by men. Throughout history, there are women have forged unknown paths to benefit all of us, not only in their achievements but as role models.


